Confessions: Saturdays at 3:30 pm or by appointment

Baptisms: Parents wishing to have their child baptized must be registered and active members for at least three months and are asked to make an appointment with the pastor, at least one month in advance.

Confirmation: Students in Seventh Grade (& any in Grades 8-12 who are not confirmed) prepare & celebrate the Sacrament each year. College students & other adults who wish to be Confirmed should contact the Pastor.

Marriage: Couples who wish to marry in the Catholic Church are asked to contact the pastor at least six months *in advance*, in order to meet with him before setting a date, or making any further arrangements. Couples are also required to attend an approved marriage preparation course, in addition to regular meetings with the pastor. (If either in the couple has been previously married, an annulment by the Church may be necessary)

Anointing of the Sick: Communal celebrations of this sacrament occur twice annually (Advent & Lent). Individual anointings are available upon request, or by appointment. Should you have family or friends in need of the sacrament, please contact the pastor as soon as possible.

Visits by Priest, Deacon, Parish Care Volunteers In addition to Fr. Dave, Fr. Jeffrey, and Deacon Mike, we have trained volunteers who will visit and bring Communion to you or a loved one at home, in rehab or nursing home, or in the hospital. Please let us know if you or someone you know would like to have these visits! (And please make sure we know when you or a loved one are homebound or hospitalized!)

RCIA: The "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults" is the process by which an adult becomes a member of the Catholic Church. If you, or someone you know, is interested in joining the Church, please contact the office for more information. RCIA is Sundays at 6:30 pm, September - April. For preparation and celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation for children (outside of the Parish School of Religion) contact the parish office.


