Please keep them in your prayers as they venture on to new experiences, that they may always stay strong in their Catholic Faith and in their relationship with the Lord Jesus!

CONFESSIONS RESUMED – REMINDER

REMINDER – Last week in Update P, I explained a new "social distanced" format of the Sacrament of Confession which Bishop Brennan would like parishes to offer in the coming weeks. The next appointment blocks of time (4:00-6:00) will be done at Our Lady of Lourdes this Wednesday (tomorrow) and Immaculate Conception this coming Sunday.
